The last seven days of Jesus' life on earth were highly passionate and deeply emotional for him and his followers. In fact, what Jesus taught and did beginning with his entrance into Jerusalem for the last time (Palm Sunday) to the crucifixion and the resurrection is what gave the Christian faith its basic theology, identity and nature. The Last Seven Words from the Cross are no exception. They have held their preeminent place within the Lent season for centuries and to the rich meaning of Christ's saving grace and his passion for the redemption of souls. The following is a list of those seven words from the cross, followed by a brief commentary for our study and reflection during Holy Week (from Palm Sunday, April 13 to the Saturday before Easter, April 19). I urge you to meditate on these words (one word per day) during that time. Easter will then mean more and do more for our spiritual journey of faith together. Also, please feel free to share these pages with anyone, keeping in mind that they are thoughts, summaries, and outlines taken from different commentaries and articles. Therefore they are not to be used except for individual and study groups without the right to duplicate, revise, or receive any monetary gifts for them.

My prayer is that our Lord will empower you with his Spirit as

you take what Jesus meant by these words to heart. Please **HAVE A BLESSED EASTER** praising God for saving you and for the strength to stand on his promises that by Christ's death on the cross we have eternal life and that because he lives, we shall live also. Amen and Amen.

The third is "love that provides":
"Dear woman here is your son. Here is your mother."
John 19:25-27

The fourth is "love that suffers":
"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:45-50

The fifth is "love that endures":
"I thirst." John 19:28, 29


The sixth is "love that completes the job": "It is finished."



It was a busy but very fruitful month. The Lord truly has opened the doors here in Steubenville for ministry outside of the walls of the church beyond my wildest dreams! I was able to meet with the Superintendent of Steubenville Schools twice (who also attended the Ginny Owens Concert with his wife), the assistant principal at Big Red twice, the principal at Edison, the principal at Indian Creek HS, the principal at Harding, the principal at JCCS and the Mayor and new City Manager of Steubenville this month. As a result Reggie Dabbs is going to 10 schools and the Gen X “Enemy Opposition” will be having assemblies in at least 3 schools so far as well as a community wide rally at the Fort Steuben Mall (in September) and I will likely be speaking at Harding Middle School again this Spring as well as at least twice next year. I also met with the Drug Task Force of Jefferson County and shared about Abigail and two members gave \$140 total to the effort. As of this time we have 416 tickets sold and distributed to businesses for the Abigail’s Angels Benefit Concert. The Lord has blessed me to be on a news story (channel 7) and have a commercial put together and run frequently (channel 9). We have raised approximately \$9,150 so far! Channel nine will cover the event the night of the concert and

a Froggy FM TV personality will introduce Ginny. I could share much more but it truly has been a blessing to be a part of this event to help Abigail. Here are some other highlights...

Feb 9th **Pizza & A Movie night featuring the film “Home Run”** Despite the snow 40 people attended the event. The movie was well received by all.

Feb 16th **“Firing Line Q&A Night”** This night was awesome! We had 20 questions prepared and got through only 5 of them because the students were asking so many questions! There is certainly a hunger within our youth to have tough questions concerning the faith answered.

Feb 23rd **“Starkdale Youth & Kids Rock Bowling Night”** - 45 students and 25 adults attended for a total of 70 people at the bowling alley.

March 4th **“Son Of God”** Movie night @ Carmike – 24 people attended the re-scheduled event on a Tuesday night. One teen girl said “It was the best movie I have ever seen...I cried for the last 15 minutes” (during the cross and resurrection scenes).

March 9th **“Storytellers Night”** - 46 attended the event including a number of people I had never seen before. Many tears were shed during the testimonies and God was truly at work in the hearts of all.
