Again, I want to thank you for your evident desire to know the Word of God. In these days of entertainment worship you are precious in the sight of the Lord!





April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month



April is Child Abuse Prevention month, and the Outreach Committee will once again place a Pinwheel of Hope tree in our Narthex. The charitable organizations which we will be supporting this year are Big Brothers Big Sisters and Hope 68.

Big Brothers Big Sisters implements one-to-one mentoring, in which a child (age 6-18) who is facing adversity is carefully matched with a caring adult mentor. Mentors help children achieve success in school, avoid risky behaviors such as getting into fights and trying drugs and alcohol, and help them improve their self-confidence.

Suggested items: Gift cards to fast food restaurants, Sincerely Yogurt, Cinema, Miniature Golf and Laser Tag (in Mall); School Supplies; Socks/Underwear; Backpacks; Headphones; Monthly Membership to YMCA.

Hope 68 exists to help those children who, for the 68 hours of the weekend, may not have enough food. Hope 68 provides food for West and East Elementary schools, as well as Harding, until the end of this school year. It costs \$2000 per week to feed these children every Friday. They are in need of donations to continue this project through the rest of the school year. Non-perishable food items and monetary donations are accepted.

Suggested items: Fruit Cups, Pudding Cups, Pop Tarts, Packaged Crackers, Juice Boxes, Cereal Bars, Fruit Snacks, Trail Mix, Packaged Cookies.

Please consider taking a pinwheel from the tree and purchase the item that has been placed on the tag. Simply bring the item back to the Narthex and place your item under the tree sometime during the month of April. We will then take the items to the charitable organizations.

Most of all, please remember these children in your prayers.
