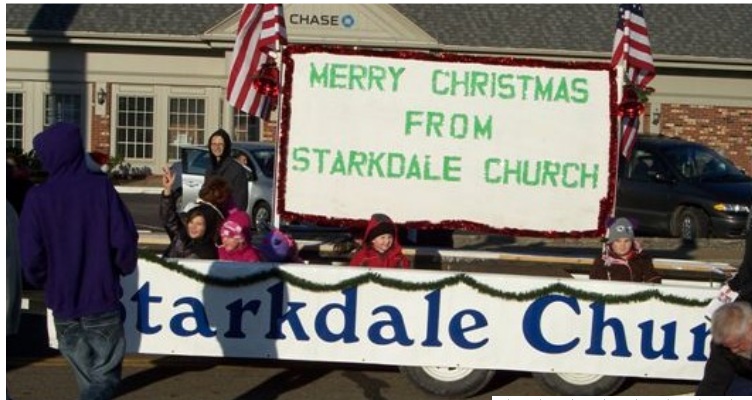

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Starkdale Family (Members, regular worship guests, and friends),

Once again, I continue to thank God for your gracious contributions of your time, talents and financial gifts to Starkdale. Thanks to your willingness to permit God to use you in Christ's ministry, our church is now blessed beyond our expectations. On Sunday, November 18, attending worship at both services totaled 226. Teenagers present were 17; children 19. The offering on that Sunday exceeded \$11,000. Moreover, on the eve of the same Sunday, the Youth fellowship, under the leadership of Rev. Bobbyjon Bauman enrolled 27 young men and women, seven of whom were first-timers. What was special about that Sunday? Nothing! But it is the evidence that as long as we are one, united in our purpose of existence and in our goals, God is with us to bless us and multiply us to his glory. The opposite is also true. When the church is about people, about feelings, hurts, and special interest agendas, it will become divided, cliquish, and will lose God's presence and Spirit. Many churches allowed that to happen. That is why the Starkdale session is always careful and always intentionally and continuously in prayer for God's Spirit to invade Starkdale and reign over it. Praise God!!! Our boasting is in the cross of Christ and in what Christ can do in us and through us. Let us therefore never forget that.

Very soon, we will be celebrating the birth of Jesus, not only in history, but most importantly in our hearts through the Spirit. Those in Christ, in whose lives Christ has been born, will see to it that the church is forever his, about him, and for his glory. Heaven is always rejoicing over young men and women from broken homes coming to know Jesus for the first time in their lives and attending church for the first time ever. Heaven's joy over one sinner's repentance is far more than its joy over an entire flock of 99 that have already been saved. Heaven rejoices over a church that contributes toward the needs of the poor, supports local, national and international mission fields, teaches the scriptures regularly and faithfully, prays for the sick, the sorrowful, the lost, the oppressed, and those in danger. Heaven rejoices when church members are humble,

spiritually mature, selfless, and always considering each other as better than themselves.

So at the close of this year, and as a result of Christ's birth in our hearts and lives, let us seek to mend wounds, forgive and seek forgiveness, love even our enemies and pray for them, help the helpless, encourage the weak, and seek the lost. These are the vital signs of healthy congregations.

Of course, spiritual health, like physical and emotional health, comes from the Lord. Without him it is impossible to be the church he wants to build. The good news is that we understand all this. Now what we need is to follow his lead, to go where God the Holy Spirit takes us next, no matter how risky it may be. Heaven is the limit, literally, to what God can do.

If you wish to be part of Christ's team, follow biblical instructions of peace, unity and purity. Come to worship, seek biblical knowledge, spend time praying, and go to the world and represent Christ through what you say, think and do. If you are not ready to do so, or called to be so, ask God the Holy Spirit to empower you to fulfill these divine objectives. He will guide you and show you the way in due time.

May this Christmas then fill your hearts with Christ's joy and peace, and may the New Year be packed with new opportunities for health, growth in the Lord, success in life, and dreams come true.

The Starkdale Youth Ministry and Ministry to all Youth and Young Adults is thriving. The following is a brief summary of our progress through the leading of the Holy Spirit thus far:

1. 20-30 Youth coming out to the meetings every Sunday night.
2. Youth Praise band starts and plays every Sunday night and also leads a song on Sunday Morning. We have between 8-10 participants in the band.
3. Launched a Children's Ministry called Little Lambs (Pre-K-K), Covenant Kids (gr. 1-4), Kingdom Seekers (gr. 5-7), Youth Alive (gr. 8-12) on Sunday mornings.
4. The Covenant Kids group have memorized the first 12 catechism questions and almost half now know the books of the Bible. They are also learning the Ten Commandments (with a song Bobbyjon wrote) and they will be memorizing a number of Bible verses in the coming weeks.
5. We have power point up and running for the music and teaching time in the youth room.
6. We had around 25 youth and 25 adults at the "To Save A Life Movie" and have heard very positive feedback from a number of youth and parents. We also had a number of young people attend as first time visitors.
7. Rick and Melanie Carver will be launching a ministry to young adults soon. The curriculum is based on the DVD "A Case For Faith" by Lee Strobel (former atheist turned Pastor).
8. Jeanne Cox has been helping out every Sunday as our female youth leader and has been doing a wonderful job.
9. We have 26 people signed up for the "Toby Mac" concert in Pittsburgh on Dec. 16th.
10. We had a special night Nov. 11th on "Peer Pressure" which involved having two Bethany College baseball players who shared their testimony. One of our own group stood up and shared his testimony since he was so moved by what the baseball players had to say. Rick Carver also shared on the topic and did a great job as well.

STARKDALE YOUTH MINISTRY

We had another awesome evening on Sunday night, October 25, with our largest attendance to that date for our "All Hallows Eve" party with 22 students. Almost everyone dressed up and we gave prizes for the persons whose costumes were deemed the most creative (Olivia, Megan), scariest (David, Isaac), most original (Sam), cutest (Gina, Abbey), Cool/Weirdest (Andrew, Madison), Most Athletic (Michael, Nathan), Prettiest (Saharah, Alayna, Ally). The overall best costume went to Olivia for her "Alice in Wonderland" inspired costume. We also played "pumpkin" bowling and hit the "ghost" piñata. Pastor Bobbyjon spoke on the topic of the history of "All Hallows Eve" on which Halloween is based and how people throughout history celebrated those who died for Christ (the martyrs) by dressing up like them and had a feast day to celebrate their lives. The youth worship team sang the song "10,000 Reasons" during the 11 A.M. service which was well received by the congregation.

Sunday night, November 4, our lesson was "Dealing with Peer Pressure". Our special guests were two base-

ball players from Bethany University who shared their testimony on how they are able to live/stand up for their faith in the midst of a hostile culture.

We had over fifty people here to view "To Save A Life" Movie event with pizza, popcorn, and pop on November 11.

And finally, we had even more young people come out for our meeting on November 18 as we discussed "Family Issues".

The Starkdale Youth led all aspects of the 11 A.M. worship service on Sunday, November 25. It was a beautiful Spirit led service.

Many of our young people took part in the Winterville Christmas Parade, handing out Starkdale informational pamphlets and goodies to the parade crowd.

The Sunday School programs are growing. Both the teachers and children are greatly enjoying their lessons and interacting with one another during the Sunday School Hour. The new "Young Adults Ministry" kicked off on Sunday, November 25. All young people ages 19-45 are welcome to attend this time of fellowship, refreshments and sound Biblical teaching.

OUTREACH COMMISSION NEEDS YOUR COOKIES!

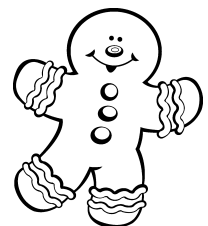
