HELPING TO SAVE THE SIGHT OF CHILDREN

Members and friends of Starkdale have been keeping busy as they organize, work, and carry thru on their yearly spring projects such as the annual Trash to Treasure Sale and the semi-annual Chicken Grill. This year's activities however have been planned and carried out with a special urgency and deep meaning.

The Kinney family, Lori, Keith, David, Abigail and Andrew, (Starkdale members) have been faced with a special challenge. Abigail has been diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder called Leger's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA) that causes the eye's retina to slowly die. There are 16 different versions of LCA. Abigail's version of LCA, caused by a gene called RDH12, is especially rare. Because very little is known about this form of LCA, there is no treatment or cure available to her. But there is hope. Recently scientists and doctors created a gene therapy treatment for one of the more common forms of LCA that restored sight to those receiving it. If this approach were to be taken for Abigail's form of LCA, there is a good chance she and others like her could avoid a life of darkness. The only way this will happen is if the necessary research and resources be directed to the effort of producing this cure. The once unthinkable goal, curing blindness, is within reach. Starkdale members are helping to make that happen by donating all the proceeds from the Trash to Treasure Sale and the Chicken Grill to "Abigail's

Angels", the fund the Kinney's have established to raise money to find a cure.

Thanks to the generosity of our community \$3,087.55 was raised by the Trash to Treasure sale and approximately \$2,100.00 from the Chicken Grill.

All funds are given to The RDH12 Fund for Sight which is a component fund of the Spartanburg County Foundation, a registered 501(3)© charitable foundation, founded by families of children with LCA caused by the RDH12 gene.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Church Members and Friends,
 Much is going on in the world today. Governments are forced to step down, religious tension spreading like wide fire, believers in Christ dying for their faith in hostile nations, decline in morals, deteriorations of human values and spiritual convictions, economic disasters, which have caused loss of jobs and of assets, unhealthy family ties, corruption in businesses, mistrust, ... and the list goes on and on. Someone even interpreted this to mean that the world is ending by the end of May of this year.

The longer I live the stronger I am convinced that the human being, no matter how clever, educated and technologically advanced, is never capable of taking care of things. Governments may believe they are the answer. Religions may think their system is the cure for all national ills. The economists may assume the solution is in their hand for a better national and international prosperity and peace. But the truth is all have failed us. Jesus said "without me, you can do nothing." He did not say "without me, you can do some things." As long as our nation, and or other nations in that regard, insists on their own efforts to solve the problems listed above, I cannot hope for better days.

Very soon, we will be celebrating our Independence Day, a day we all cherish, a day that reminds us that as tough as the days of our settlers and reformers were, their dependence on the God of the Bible and their Christian convictions made them survive the worst of wars and the worst of economic conditions. The American

living standards and liberties, which former generations experienced for more than two and half centuries, are contributed to prayers and Bible readings, and the following of biblical principles. True, in their desperation, our settlers and even the early patriarchs made mistakes and allowed for some injustices (such as slavery), yet as the days went by, later generations came to their senses and knew that was a major negative in their history. The laws then began to treat all men as equal and the majority of Americans have repented from their discrimination and prejudices.

Then little by little, God was removed from all arenas of life, prayers became forbidden in public places, and laws were formed to permit sinful life styles and sinful acts to be supported by local and national governments. The result is, once again, the list hinted on at the opening of this letter.

I still believe that God can save America if the Christian community is constantly on its knees praying that Jesus would be sought by people, the Bible be read and studied and faithfully proclaimed from the pulpit, and American Christians would do everything they can to be educated voters and faithful in honoring God. God says in the scriptures that he honors those who honor him. Do you remember Abraham pleading to God to deliver Sodom and Gomorrah from his upcoming wrath? God answered Abraham that if there were forty or thirty or even twenty who were truly faithful to him, he would not destroy those two cities. What God was saying is that

he would for the sake of the few who are faithful to him, he would bless and protect them and where they live. Well, Christians in America are a lot more than true believers in Sodom and Gomorrah. Christians in American can be a powerful force for the restoration of America. But it all begins with humility, seeking God's face, repenting from all evil, and praying. It can happen. God can heal our land. It is never too late. **In 2 Chronicles 7:14 God promises us: *If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.*** It's time to help fulfill this promise.
