Dear Starkdale Family and Friends,

The thing that needs to be avoided though is for a church to remain the same, to get stuck or become stagnant.

Ron Edmondson, a church planter and pastor with a heart for strategy, leadership and marketing is especially geared toward developing churches and growing and improving the Kingdom of God. He says, "I was talking with a church recently that had explosive growth, but things have slowed". They wanted to know why they were not growing any longer. I decided to share my quick answer here.

In my experience, the reasons for getting stuck and/or halting growth include:

You get comfortable...It's okay to be comfortable, but when you hang out there too long, it can be dangerous, because you stop trying new things to spur growth and excitement. You quit dreaming...Dreams inspire, challenge, and grow people and organizations. You'll never dream bigger than the dreams God has for you or your church.

You stop taking risks...You can't succeed at anything without a measure of risk. Playing it safe never grows anything. The call of God always involves risk-taking.

You start maintaining...When you fall into the mode of protecting what you have, you'll be less likely to encourage growth for fear of losing ground.


You fail to walk by



Enjoy a picnic lunch with your family under the shade of our spacious pavilions. Walk down Cherry-tree Lane. The arching bridges, tiled courtyards, and large gazebo are joined with a five-foot-wide paved walkway, just under a mile long, suitable for strollers and wheelchairs.

Don't miss a chance to enjoy the wonders of God's creation in our <u>Petting Zoo</u>—something that's sure to please children of all ages or just the child in you.

Noah's Café is a perfect stopping place for tired and hungry visitors where you can relax with a sandwich and salad or a snack and beverage. Enjoy seasonal delights at the Lakeside Grill. Or stop for a specialty coffee and more at the Palm Café.



To continue in the baseball vernacular we feel they all hit their final home run and rounded the bases and crossed home plate to be at home safe with our Lord.


