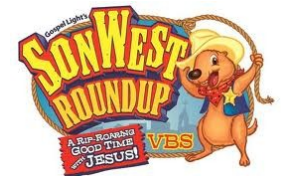

In loving appreciation to my church family.

Just to let the people of Starkdale Church know how thankful we are to be part of this church. It's like no other that I know of. We are very fortunate since my fall on March 8th I received many cards, gifts, visits, flowers, and phone calls. Then I got a phone call that different members had volunteered to bring dinners to us. Their kindness was unbelievable. It was more than enough and very delicious.

SERVICE ABOVE SELF

My faith in the Lord has always taught me to put others above myself. I believe that this is what service is all about. Anything a person can do to help others is not only beneficial to those helped, but also to oneself. Words cannot describe how wonderful it feels to invest in the lives of others by serving and giving your love and time to them.

What has taught me the most about serving others is being involved in my local church and being deeply involved in youth ministry. While I lived in Wisconsin, I had many opportunities to impact the lives of others locally. I volunteered at the Salvation Army Homeless shelter, the Three Gaits horse farm which builds self esteem in handicapped children through riding horses, sorting food at the Second Harvest food bank, feeding the homeless through the "Luke House" ministry, volunteering for the local Red Cross and many other activities serving the under resourced. Once I moved to Steubenville, I had the opportunity to be a part of the Young Ambassadors program which is benefiting the Fourth Street Health Center.

I have also found great joy in serving outside of my hometown by going on a number of mission trips and service projects such as helping with Habitat for Humanity in New Orleans after hurricane Katrina and in Birmingham Ala-

bama after the tornadoes that ravaged that region of Alabama. I also served the poor in Washington DC, helped paint a school in a low income area in Baltimore Maryland, and a few months ago went on a service project in which we helped fix up facilities used primarily by at risk youth in Akron, Ohio.

All of my mission trips were great opportunities, but the one that impacted me most was the mission trip I took to Camden, New Jersey two years ago. Camden has one of the highest crime rates in the United States, only about 2/3 of their high school students graduate, and two out of every five residents are living in a state that places them below the national poverty line. Seeing and working in an area like this made me realize how blessed I am to live in a safe area with good schools.

In Camden, my church youth group was involved in an event called "Hope Fest". It was located in a city park. At the event we gave needy families backpacks, school supplies, children's books and groceries at no cost. Hope Fest also had games for the kids, and live bands to entertain adults. There were around 2000 people in attendance. This event took a lot of hard work, but the outcome was amazing. (continued on page 14)
