A Message from the Pastor -

Dear Starkdale Family (Members, Frequent Worship Guests, and Friends),

After ten blessed and rewarding years of ministry at Starkdale, and having been praying for God's guidance, I have now come to the decision to seek partial retirement in a part time ministerial position wherever the Lord may choose to lead me. I received God's call to serve as pastor of Starkdale on May 1, 2005, and as announced on Sunday, March 8, my ministry at Starkdale will terminate on July 30th. This decision was prompted by several factors.

First, I am already beyond the retirement age; on June 27, I'll be 69.

Second, the rules of the Board of Pensions of the PCUSA (our former denomination) make it risky to postpone my decision in regards to what percentage my wife would receive after my death. If I don't make this decision now and something happens to me before my retirement, Vickey would get only half of what she is entitled to receive. Moreover, after my retirement decision has been made and Vickey's future income has been decided, the rules of the Board of Pensions forbid me to work for the same church even in a part time position.

Third, it is highly recommended that any pastorate should not go beyond eight to twelve years. Pastors have ways of knowing when it is time for them to step down. I believe that I have done all I could do for our ministry together. Now the church is healthy, ripe and ready for a new, and possibly, different kind of leadership.

Fourth, while my spirit is willing to serve the Lord in full capacity and force, the flesh is weak. Aging has its

Fifth, there are things that I have been needing to do and have been looking forward to doing (such as spending more time with Vickey, travelling, visiting with friends and relatives, authoring a book or two, ...etc.). I couldn't do but a little of that while in the fulltime ministry.

Beyond these reasons there are no other. Usually, people wonder when their pastors resign or retire: Did anyone make him mad? Was he forced to step down? Are their problems with the church that made him say "enough is enough?" Did he find a better opportunity for ministry than here?

Before God <u>I promise</u> you that no church-related diffi-

culty, and no other reason than the ones I have already mentioned above, has, in any form or fashion, impacted my decision to retire. I promise you also that I will remain, in the Spirit, a member of Starkdale as long as I shall live. Starkdale will continue to be the highlight of my life thanks to your love, warmth, enthusiasm about the Lord, generosity, hospitality, and most of all, your positive and encouraging response to my work along your side. Moreover, I promise to keep you and your work in Christ's name in my prayers. I hope you would do the same and keep Vickey and me in your prayers. Lovingly and sincerely, Philip Makari

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month



The Neighborhood House located in Steubenville is the longest operating daycare and preschool in Jefferson County. It is a non-profit organization that provides child care services to all families. Cost is on a sliding scale based on the ability to pay. It is subsidized by the Ohio Department of Jobs & Family Services. Many of the children who attend are court appointed.

Since April is Child Abuse Prevention month, the Outreach Committee contacted The Neighborhood House to find out how we could help. They requested a variety of inexpensive items which benefit the children such as gold fish crackers, soup, diapers etc.

In keeping with the Children's Service theme of pinwheels, we will once again place a "Pinwheel of Hope" tree in our Narthex. Please consider taking a pinwheel from the tree and purchase the item that has been placed on the pinwheel. Simply bring the item back to the Narthex and place your item under the tree sometime during the month of April. We will then take the items to The Neighborhood House. He Is Not Here; He is Risen!

There are "many infallible proofs" of the bodily resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, but the testimony of the empty tomb is the most conclusive of all. living One among the dead? He is not here, but He is risen. Luke 24:1-6 (NASB)


