

Unbelievable! Isn't it? Is it really Advent and Christmastime already? Truly, as we grow older our days pass like hours, and our weeks, like days.

I don't know what to make of this, except that the Bible has been saying it over and over again. 1 Chronicles 29:15 tells us "We are foreigners and strangers in God's sight, as were all our ancestors. Our days on earth are like a shadow ..." Psalm 103:15-15 echoes the same: it reads "The life of mortals is like grass, they flourish like a flower of the field; the wind blows over it and it is gone, and its place remembers it no more. In Psalm 39:4, the Psalmist prays saying, "O Lord, make me know my end and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting I am!" Literally, there are hundreds of biblical verses

short our lives on earth are and how quickly they come to an end. But the Good News of Advent is that while our lives on earth pass quickly, they do not pass to nothingness. They have a sure and living hope, a definite destiny.

The anticipated return of our Savior to do away with all forms of evil and to rule in righteousness, a promise that we celebrate during the four weeks before **Christmas** known as the Advent Season, is our ultimate and glorious destiny. Our journey of faith (the life journey of those who believe in Christ), as I have shared in a recent sermon, originates in God and travels toward God. It is a journey that begins with **the cross** and ends with the crown. It begins with "I believe" and ends with "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter into the joy of your lord." It begins with "second birth" and ends with "born anew into a living hope (in heaven) through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." It begins with "a life
