

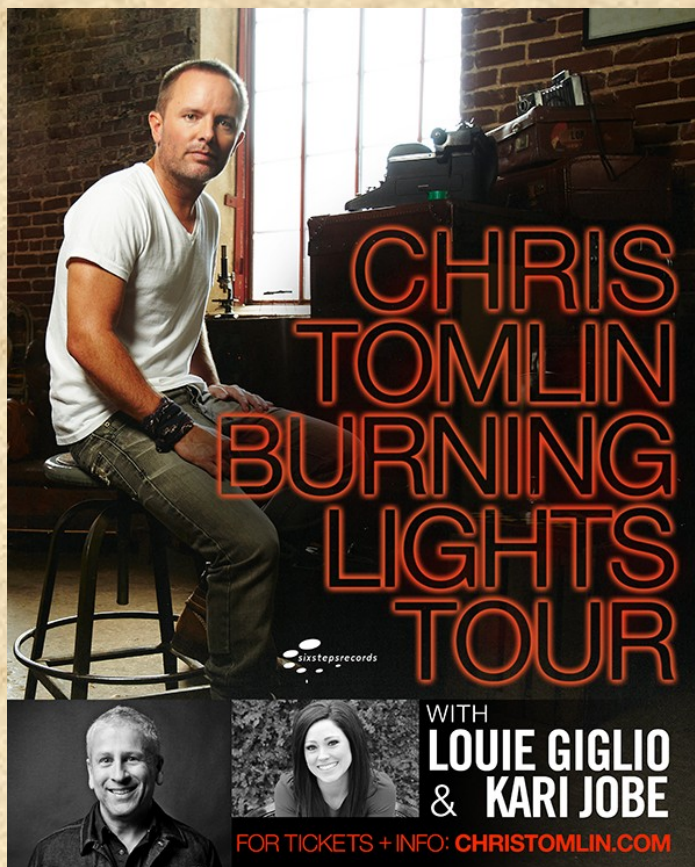

Dear Starkdale Family (Members, Friends, and Regular Worship Guests),

Several of you have been asking if our church is already and officially an Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC), and if so, why isn't there a story about that in the newspaper? The answer to this question is "Yes, Starkdale is officially an Evangelical Presbyterian Church; with minor exceptions." Although our pastors and our elders were examined and were received by the EPC denomination, a commission from the Presbytery of the Alleghenies has to meet with all of our members, lead them in worship, install the pastors and have the members vow their commitment to the EPC constitution. That time will be decided soon. Please watch for the announcement pertaining to this important meeting in the Sunday bulletins. After this step is taken, we will inform our community of the change and reasons for it.

Many of you have expressed your conviction that this step we have taken toward the EPC was fully from the Lord. We are beginning to see growth in all aspects of our ministry. Several from neighboring churches are considering membership with us. The Bible study classes have also attracted new comers.

Moreover, with Bobbyjon on our staff and his vibrant ministry at full force and of which many of you are aware, some community families are now inquiring about our youth programs. This is going to soon impact our church in new and positive ways. Praise God! I would not be surprised if we would be compelled to add an-

other service to our weekly Sunday services.

On a final note, I urge each of you to be an active participant of what is being done on Sundays and during the week. Total commitment to Jesus Christ, who himself committed totally to our wellbeing and our salvation through his sacrificial death for us, is not an option for those who believe they are saved. The chief end of our purpose for living is to glorify God through our obedience to him, and to enjoy him through our worship of him and through serving in his name. Actually, we have no right to refer to ourselves as believers in Jesus Christ if we are not obedient to his call of us. Jesus once asked his followers, "Why do you call me Lord and not do what I tell you (Luke 6:46)?"

I know that life is hectic and often highly demanding of our time and energy. But the fact still is that we are frequently able to make the time and the effort for the things we enjoy. Why can't God be one of those priorities that we enjoy? Above all, isn't God the reason we were born? Isn't he the one that has given us all that we have? Our time, our jobs, our incomes, our relationships are all from him. What are we giving to him in return? The Bible exhorts us to deal with these questions sooner than later.

There is no way around it. We owe God our worship and our loyalty to the studying of his word and to growing in him and for him. All this talk about being too busy does not apply to the one who is constantly busy blessing us.

I hope and pray while we are still at the early part of this new year that we use our time and energy wisely, to place God on the top of our daily priorities. Let us never forget that when our days on earth are over, all that will count as worthy of our lives, all that matters and that would bear eternal consequences either in our favor or against it, is what type of relationship we each had toward our Creator Redeemer God while on earth. We will be rewarded accordingly.

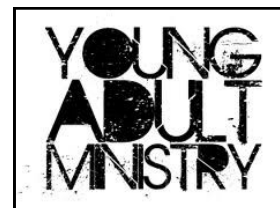

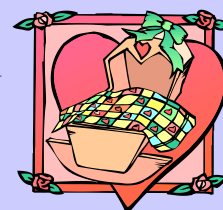

DISAPPOINTMENTS

“Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a longing fulfilled is a tree of life.” Proverbs 13:12

Life is filled with disappointments. Many of God’s greatest servants experienced deep disappointment in their journeys of faithfulness to God. Joseph, after spending years as a slave and in jail for crimes that he did not commit, revealed deep disappointment when he was forgotten another two years in prison. John the Baptist, when awaiting execution, doubted whether Jesus was, in fact, the Christ because he was sitting there awaiting his death.
