Dear Starkdale Family (members, friends, and regular worship guests),

Very often people wonder what Presbyterians believe. Some regular visitors to our church are inquiring about what makes us who we are. The following facts are basic to our spiritual convictions, which I hope would help deepen our understanding of our theology.

First, our definitions: The word "theology" is made of two words, combined they mean "the study of God." Implied, of course, are "the teachings pertaining to the things of God". The word

"Presbyterian" comes for the Greek word "presbeteros" which means "elder". A Presbyterian is one who belongs to a Reformed Protestant church that conducts its business through representatives. elected by the congregations, to make decisions on behalf of the members. Those representatives are referred to as "elders". Elders meet monthly and as needed to attend to the physical facilities and spiritual and social needs of the congregation. A Presbyterian church then is a church that is governed by elders elected by the congregation.

Second, our doctrines (i.e. biblical beliefs and spiritual convictions):

 We believe that the Bible in its entirety is God's Word. The Bible is inspired (meaning God

- -breathed or God-given) through his prophets and apostles.
- We believe that God is one, though he reveals himself to us in three Persons. He is over us (as our invisible heavenly Father), with us (as the Son the visible embodiment of the Father, Jesus Christ), and in and through us (as the Holy Spirit).
- from sin and eternal death (i.e. hell) is only possible through receiving Jesus Christ as our personal Savior and Lord. Salvation is never through any thing we are or anything we do. Salvation is by the grace of God through faith in Jesus Christ and what he has done for us on the cross (as he dies paying the price for our sins).
- We believe that the church is the people of God. Those who sincerely have believed in Jesus Christ (i.e. those who are saved by his death on the cross) are his true church. Sometimes, they are referred to as "the Body of Christ".
- We believe that the <u>scriptures</u> <u>alone</u> are God's Word to the church. <u>Jesus Christ</u> alone is the Head and Redeemer of the church. God's <u>Grace alone</u> (not our own efforts) are the means of the salvation of the church and the way to having eternal life. <u>Faith alone</u> is the assurance by which the church has






THE JOY OF **CHRISTMASTIME**

been saved. And to God alone is the church thankful for its salvation from sin and hell.

- We believe that the Holy Spirit is God indwelling us to empower us to live the righteous life that he intends for his people, to strengthen us in our weakness, to help us grow in our knowledge and experience of God and his word, to comfort us in our time of trouble, and to inspire and motivate us to lead others to the saving grace of Jesus Christ (i.e. evangelism).
- We believe that we are the recipients of eternal life on the very day we confess Jesus Christ as our Savior. By this we mean that once we are saved, we are given the gift of eternal life; and that once we are saved, we can never lose our salvation.
- We believe that Jesus Christ will return one day. On that day, history as we know it will come to an end, evil will be judged and eliminated once and for all, and believers in him will live under his reign forever in an environment free from sin, suffering or dying again.
- We believe that the souls of believers in Jesus Christ will go directly to heaven upon their death, and that the souls of nonbelievers will go to a place of torment (hell).
- We believe in two sacraments, baptism and communion.

Third, our structure: As mentioned earlier, we are a church that is led by elders, whose responsibility is to oversee the needs, the programs, and the various ministries of the church. The teaching elders are the pastors of the church. The ruling elders are the ones who attend to the leg-work needs of the church, make decisions, organize committees, handling finances ... etc. Elders are also spiritual advisors. They plan for worship, visit with the sick, pray for the people and with them, accompany pastors in some of the pastoral duties ...

Fourth, our constitution: While the Bible is our absolute standard for attending to all the needs of ministry, our constitution is made of two parts: The first is the Book of Confessions (this is a detailed record of our biblical beliefs); the second is the Book of Order (this is a detailed record of how the church shall govern its business). The Book of Order is divided into three sections. One is for governing the church. The second is for the rules of handling worship in decency and order. The third is for procedures used for disciplining anyone (including pastors) who may act in ways that cause dissentions, spread false teachings, or

may be guilty of immoral conduct.

Moreover, the Starkdale church administers <u>baptism</u> at any time as is requested for infants or adults, provided that the person has not been baptized before in another church. <u>Communion is</u> administered on the second Sunday of each month except for the month of October when Communion is on the first Sunday (worldwide communion Sunday).

Regular worship guests of Starkdale may become members of the church through one of the following methods: The first is by a letter of transfer (i.e. transferring their membership from the church they are presently attending to ours). The second is by reaffirmation of faith (i.e. having been without a church for a period of time, a person may request to reaffirm their faith in Jesus Christ by joining the church.) The third is by profession of faith (i.e. the person was never a member of any church, but now is seeking membership at Starkdale). The fourth is by affiliation (i.e. the person may keep his or her membership active in their original church, but choose to associate himself or herself with the Starkdale church). This fourth method entitles affiliate members to all privileges and responsibilities of the church except voting on issues.

Church giving is strictly a private matter between God and the individual. It is kept confidential by two people (the secretary and the treasurer). Not even pastors are given information on who is contributing to God's work and how much.



So, Christmas is over and a new year has begun. I hope you all have some good memories, even though I know for some of you there was sorrow and heartache this past year. Our hearts go out to you, and you are in our prayers.

My family and I have a friend whom we have known for years. She is now in a nursing home. We went to visit her on Christmas Day. We visited with her and sang some Christmas carols. When we asked her what her favorite Christmas song was, she replied "Santa Claus is Coming to Town". So we sang that one, too.

I have been back to see her since then. She loves to talk about our time together on Christmas. She is 99 years old and her grandchildren live in Florida and in Columbus. They called but were unable to visit. She has no other family.

As one who goes to the nursing home frequently, I know that for those who can remember, they hang on to those memories of Christmas for a long time. Sometimes they tell these stories about their Christmas over and over again.

Sadly, some folks never have anyone come to visit them. Oh, the

nursing home staff make a big fuss over them, but the fact is, they still miss their families and friends. They are sad and lonely. So as the new year begins let us resolve not to forget the shut-ins and those in the nursing home. First a card, a call can brighten their day. Visiting them is a great thing to do. I realize how hard it is for us to get out of our comfort zone. I understand that going to a nursing home can be depressing. And, sometimes, we do not like the sights, sounds, or the smell. We get there and we are not sure what to say.

I have found that talking about family, friends, television shows, food, and memories are good things. And at the end of the visit ask if you can pray for them. First saying, "God bless Jim, or John, or Betty or Jane", do that and you have said a prayer. You can do it.

Finally, remember Jesus words: "If you have done it unto the least of these, you have done it unto me. Matthew 25:45.
