Dear Starkdale Family (members, friends, and worship guests),

Many of you have expressed joy and excitement about the announcement made in the June issue of the Chimes regarding securing land for relocation in the future due to the possible growth in our area. As far as I know, only two feel that it is not time yet to take such a step. The comments made were that we have not yet reached the full capacity of our sanctuary, that there are no clear signs yet for community growth, and that there are other alternatives to handle the parking issue (i.e. park across from Starkdale and hire a policeman to help us cross the street to the church).

I appreciate these comments. They are legitimate options for our present concerns. But the issue at hand is not the present; it is the future. We

are not thinking about finding solutions pertaining to our present needs; we are managing very well thanks to your sacrifices. The session is thinking ahead regarding the upcoming future growth. From what we know and have seen so far, there are definite signs of gradual growth in our community which may consume the few pieces of land that are available in our Starkdale immediate area. So instead of waiting, the session has agreed to at least purchase the land (though no action has been taken yet, since this has to be approved by the congregation and the Presbytery). If growth does not happen and the church does not see the need for expansion, then no harm is done; the land can be sold even with a better price than the one for which we may purchase it.

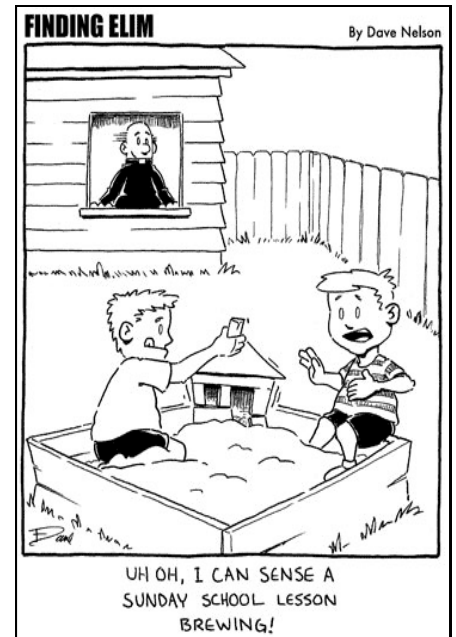
FLOCK TALK

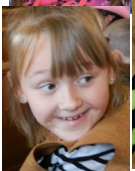
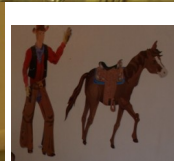
From VBS Director: Sandy Conrad:


