Dear Starkdale Family, I continue to give thanks to God for the role you play in our ministry. Many of you are:

Intentional in participating in worship and church school on Sundays. Our attendance is holding up, even after we changed the time for worship. We have an average attendance between 170 and 185 weekly, according to the elders' weekly count.

Active in our midweek Bible studies which also has enrolled people from at least 9 denominations. Attendance is between 45 to 52 (Tuesday and Wednesday study- times combined)

Involved in contacting, and visiting with, shut-ins and those who are hospitalized.

Always inviting neighbors and friends to worship and to social gatherings.

Generous with your contributions, which have allowed us to do more for the community.

Committed to helping children learn the scriptures, sing God's praises, and empowering them to become the future spiritual leaders of the church. This shows as the children lead in songs, prayers and in reciting the scriptures every Sunday.

Giving generously of your time to serve in soup kitchens, meals-on-wheels, and Habitat for Humanity, among other programs.



I am amazed at your enthusiasm and the degree by which you care, the funds you are raising for good causes, your participation in nursing home monthly worship services, your love and support for the Children's Home of Jefferson County, your weekly church hospitality, ... etc.

You are indeed the model of effective evangelism, productive community outreach, far reaching Christian education efforts, music excellence, creative worship, and generous hospitality. It is no wonder that our church continues to grow and become more and more appealing to people who are looking for a home church. Have you noticed the number of weekly visitors, many of whom don't rush to their cars following the service, but join us for hospitality hour after church? Some are even beginning to talk about joining. Thank you!

We have come a long way, but we still have not reached our full potentials. I would say that we still have at least 25% of us who have not been given things to do in Christ's name. Very often we may judge them as "not interested" or "not willing." My ministerial experience has taught me that their seemingly lack of commitment is often not their fault. They might not know how to go

about getting involved, since they were not Presbyterians all their lives. They may not be familiar with our system. They might be waiting for someone to befriend them before they commit to anything. They might be unaware of the areas that need their help ... etc.

I urge every commission and taskforce chairperson to take the initiative, identify those people, befriend them, and invite them to share in our ministry. They all are gifted and have a lot to offer. It is not right that we don't include them. None of us should be possessive of our little corners as if church work is limited to the ability of the few.

Romans 12 is the model of the church that Christ came to build. It speaks of how this should be done. I hope and pray for 100 % involvement on the part of all who belong to our church family.
