Dear Starkdale Family (Members,
Worship Guests, and friends),

I am truly excited and, in fact, overjoyed as I listen to “the talk of the town” regarding the growth that is coming our way. All eyes are watching, and many have already experienced the benefits of new opportunities for economic growth. From drilling for oil, to possibilities for new department stores and restaurants, to quicker house sales, to ministerial gatherings geared toward meeting the growing needs and concerns of our citizens, truly God has answered our prayers. Steubenville might have had the national attention in a negative way, but recovery, even from that, is already taking place. I am convinced that seven years of hoping and praying for economic growth via *Faith in the Future* and through ecumenical efforts are beginning to pay off. This reminds me of Pharaoh’s Dream and how God after seven years of famine had

blessed Egypt with unexpected abundance that benefited the Israelites during their seven years of famine. We should all rejoice in what God is doing and give him the glory.

But where is the Starkdale church within this context? We are constantly seeing a good number of regular worship guests. One of the main reasons for this is our impacting ministry to children, youth and younger families. Several community families who had nothing to do with the church before are now regular guests at worship. Rev. Bauman has indeed made the big Christian difference in this area. But he is not in this alone. The people who share in his ministry and who are working very closely with the youth as mentors, counselors and advisors are making a huge impact. Every young man and young woman is getting the personal attention they deserve as they struggle with their daily challenges and as they seek to grow in

Christ. I have seen how Jeanne Cox, Janice Whitaker, John Parkinson, Kylee Paris, and several others relate to the youth, befriend them, and encourage them to keep focused on Jesus Christ as their only hope in life. Along Rev. Bauman's side, these individuals are God-sent.

Please understand that I am not simply promoting a particular ministry. I have personally attended the youth gatherings on numerous occasions and was amazed at what God is doing in that area. Ask yourself then "can we really put a price tag on helping rescue a young woman from a cult that she had joined, or a young man contemplating suicide, or enabling some to forsake their drug-addicted life, or explain God's saving grace to someone who is confused and utterly lost? Well, that is what I am talking about. While the harvest is plentiful and the Lord is sending more and more people our way, and whereas growth by the thousands is expected for our area within the next 3 to 5 years, we should ask "what must we do?" The session and some of our church members have already taken the first two steps. They are lifting up this concern daily in their prayers. They also are contemplating the possibility of at least securing a piece of

land, since land maybe scarce very soon.

Often new buildings and growth in the community work together to excite people who have been looking for a church that is alive and healthy. New families will join; new ministries will be added, new expressions of joy and fulfillment will be established. But most of all, the Lord will be glorified.

I am truly convinced that God is leading me to share this with you at this time before it is too late. Of course I may not still be active on the staff of Starkdale as pastor when the church finalizes these plans. But it is my responsibility as "called by God" to lead your thinking in that direction.

Are we willing to meet these demands? Are we ready for these challenges? How? When? Is now the time to begin thinking about the future? Can we honestly welcome, and are we open to, what God may inspire us to be doing soon? Our God is "making everything new" in Steubenville, Wintersville and their surrounding areas. Shouldn't his church rise up to the occasion and become a major part of what he is doing? While this may be a great concern for me and several others

who may not be accustomed to taking risks such as serious as this one, I must keep on raising these questions.

To put this whole concept in different words, the elders' call to the ministry of Starkdale is changing and is taking a different direction, similar to the call of Moses. Moses did not want to be part of what God wanted him to do. Yet, Moses had to do as he was led and told by God. Can our elders say "no" to growth, to more opportunities for outreach, to winning more souls for Christ? Should they be asking: Where would people park? Where would the youth meet? Can we help build a community youth-center staffed with spiritual leaders and laborers? In other words, should we, or should we not possess a new vision for the new times in which we are living now?

In conclusion, I must say that the purpose of this letter is to include you in the thinking process. You are invited to deal with this common concern by answering the following and similar questions you might have:

How can we adequately be prepared for what God is already doing in our community and in our church (i.e. growth)?

How do we perceive Starkdale to be like five years from now?

Right now, if we have to have one worship service instead of two, especially during the months between September and May, we cannot seat everyone, much less, have an adequate parking for all. As you can see, we cannot dismiss this concern as insignificant.

I encourage each one of you who read this letter to respond only through regular mail (no phone calls, no emails, no texting, and no pastoral conversations) since this is an issue that has to be handled by the elders and the congregation during meetings approved by the Book of Order.

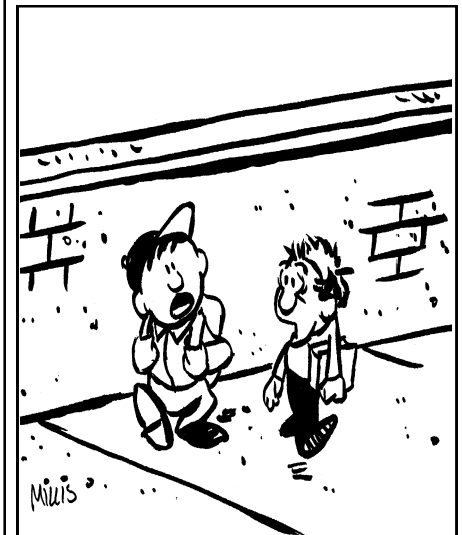
To Susan Gossett in the death of her mother, Lillian Gossett, on May 2. Susan is a former member of Starkdale Church.

OUTREACH COMMISSION NEWS

The Outreach Commission of Starkdale Presbyterian Church, chose 'A Caring Place' Child Advocacy Center as this year's benefactor for their annual Pinwheel Tree of Hope.

One of many of Starkdale's ministries is the awareness and prevention of Child Abuse.

A Caring Place, located on Route 43 in Wintersville, provides a unique and critical service to children who are victims or witnesses of abuse. The center provides an interview room where children may comfortably talk to professionals, seek guidance and understanding. The Center also provides medical exams for child sexual abuse victims and educational/prevention information to the community.

Outreach Commission member, Cindy Sagrilla, contacted *A Caring Place* Director- Mary Ann Donnelly. Mary Ann was excited with our congregation's offer of generosity and support. Mary Ann provided us a list of needed children's activity supplies. Sagrilla went on to explain, "an item name was placed on each mini pinwheel and placed on our narthex tree. Over 100 pinwheels adorned the tree.

Church members were asked to select a pinwheel(s), purchase the item(s) and place them under our Tree of Hope. Proudly, I can say, every 'pinwheel' was successfully provided."

"Our church mission and continued outreach go hand-in-hand serving the people of our community," Sagrilla concludes.

April was Child Abuse Awareness month. To draw more attention to the topic and the Christ-like nature of this cause, numerous large pinwheels lined the entrance to Starkdale Church.

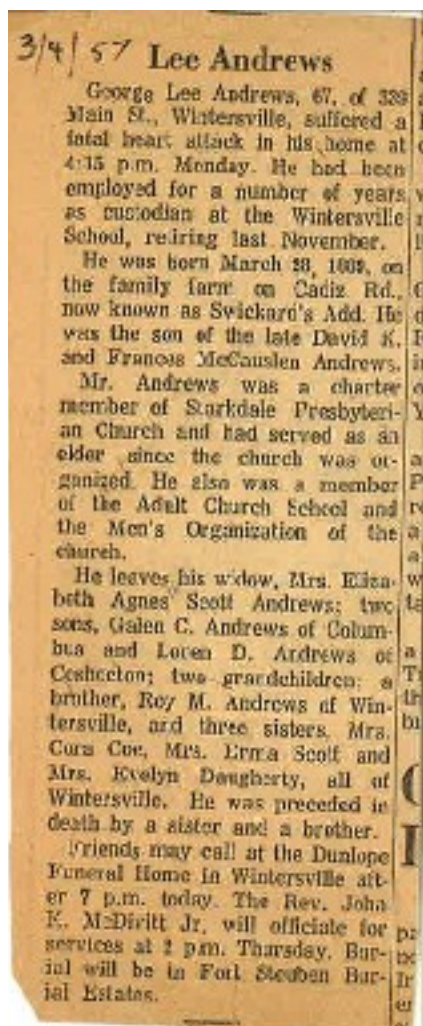
Soup Kitchen Report:

The woman who donated these items had purchased a Bible at a Yard Sale in Wintersville and in the pages of the Bible was tucked this obituary and memorial card:

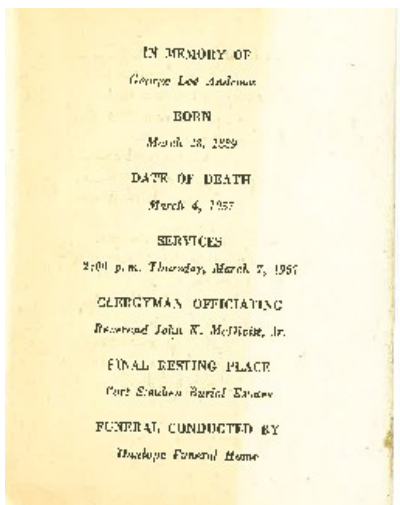


Truly, the old saying,
