Dear Starkdale Members, Worship guests, and Friends,

It won't be long now before we join another Presbyterian denomination. Our elders have truly been busy corresponding with our former Presbytery, regularly meeting with, and updating our lawyer and counselor about the legal aspects of church property, deeds, and other concerns, and most of all, studying and comparing between the different Presbyterian denominations available for us to join. In fact, our entire Board of Elders (the session) has unanimously attended the Allegheny Presbytery of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church, held in Portersville, PA on Saturday, February 25<sup>th</sup>. The purpose of the visit was to closely examine the positive and negative characteristics of that denomination. A thorough report will be shared with you in the near future.

And though we don't yet know which Presbyterian denomination we will join, since there is much to be investigated and much more to be discussed, I don't mind sharing with you some of the facts about the Evangelical Presbyterian denomination whose Presbytery we have visited already:

**First**, as of May 24, 2012, the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC) has 306 congregations. This is an increase of 121 churches (65%) since 2007, when it had 185 churches. One response to this change is the possible crea-

tion of new local and closer presbyteries.

**Second**, a defining characteristic of the EPC is that it is "missional" in addition to being Presbyterian, Reformed and Evangelical. This missional emphasis is a declaration of renewed passion for God's mission to share the life-changing Gospel of Jesus Christ in word and deed to the mission field that includes community, country and world.

**Third**, while the world is constantly changing, and as a result, all Christian denominations are facing spiritual attacks that enforce change, what does not and will not change in relationship to the EPC is its commitment to Jesus Christ, his Gospel and his Word.

**Fourth**, presently serving in the EPC are 449 Teaching Elders (i.e. pastors) serving EPC congregations, 6 Teaching Elders serving as Administrators, 88 Teaching Elders serving in out-of-bounds ministries, 36 Teaching Elders serving in Chaplaincy ministries, 19 Teaching Elders who are serving as EPC World Outreach missionaries, 78 Teaching Elders who are retired from fulltime ministry (although many are still actively engaged in activities such as leading Bible studies, and volunteering as chaplains), and 65 Teaching Elders currently without a presbytery-approved call. Ruling Elders (i.e. members of sessions) are a total of 2,786 serving in its 306 EPC churches.

**Fifth**, almost all the churches that are leaving the PCUSA are leaning to joining the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. The reason is that they are similar in most aspects except theological views.

Of course it is too early to know for sure if this is the direction we will follow for our church. I ask you to:

- A)** Keep this matter in prayer.
- B)** Keep being faithful to the Starkdale ministry by attending, participating and giving to its ministry cheerfully and generously of your time, skills, and money.
- C)** Keep yourself up-to date with what is going on. We have a vibrant ministry and an invaluable congregation with a lot more to come (i.e. youth pastor, new and possibly different worship experiences in addition to what we already have, and new outreach programs).

And then we look forward to Easter and celebrating the resurrection of Christ and his triumph over death!



## TAKE TIME TO PRAY:

Would you like praying to become more meaningful to you? Would you want to deepen your prayer life? There are opportunities at Starkdale for these things to happen for you.

The adult Sunday School class taught by Audrey Kerr is going to read and discuss "A Praying Life" by Paul E. Miller.

I heard this book being discussed by a couple of talk show hosts on WORD FM on my way home from work one day. The woman was saying it was one of her favorite books from last year because it had changed the way she felt about prayer and had greatly helped her prayer life. I am so excited about offering this to all of us at Starkdale because we all need a "shot in the arm" when it comes to praying. Here is an excerpt from the forward of Paul Miller's book:

*"Prayer-it tends to become a production and a problem.*

*Life-it's always a production and a problem. You cycle through your to-do list, your anxieties, distractions, pressures, pleasures, and irritants. God-he's there, somewhere, sometimes. Somehow those two problematic productions and the Lord of heaven and earth don't all get on the same page very often.*

*But prayer isn't meant to be a production or a problem. And God is here now. Prayer is meant to be a conversation where your life and your God meet."*

Paul Miller understands that. "A Praying Life" aims to help you join him in living out that understanding.

Paul offers you a vision for how a working fellowship with God thinks, talks, feels, and acts. He takes you inside his family life and his prayer life. By seeing how life and God weave together, you'll discover the joy of living as

God's child, experiencing the adventure of walking closely with your Father and good Shepherd.

Sounds so good, doesn't it? The books are on order, (and there will be plenty for everyone who attends), and I am excited to get started. We will let you know when this will begin. I believe "A Praying Life" will bring a living, vibrant reality to our prayers. Also we'll have the best opportunity ever to join together in prayer, as a Monday evening prayer time is going to resume at our church on Monday evening March 5<sup>th</sup>.

Let me ask you, Do you think the church in America is a praying church? Do you think Starkdale is a praying church? Well we can be! God has invited us to come into His presence through our Lord Jesus Christ and make our requests known to Him. How wonderful! God hears and answers prayer. ## QUILTERS InC.

The members of Quilters InC. (Quilters in Christ) have been busy the last two months sewing up quilts for the charity “Quilts for Kids”. Fabric is donated and cut into strips by the “Quilts for Kids” staff and then mailed to Quilt circles, guilds, etc. to be sewn into quilts that are subsequently returned to the national office and then distributed to hospitals and other care agencies for hurting kids. Each member of Quilters InC. sewed at least one quilt in the “Rail Fence” pattern. Pictured below are several of our quilters with their quilts. The quilters are also encouraged to pray for the child who will eventually receive the quilt.

Quilters InC. members are on the move again in March. They will attend the “Amish Country Mini Quilt Shop and Cuisine Hop” on Friday, March 23. Five Berlin, Ohio area quilt shops will be visited where each “hopper” will receive a quilt block pattern and a recipe. At 2:30 the “hoppers” will converge on the Berlin Christian Fellowship Church where the finished quilts from each shop will be displayed and tasty samples of each recipe distributed will be available. Once again our two male chaperones Bob Burns and Bob Kaine (the two Bob’s as the females affectionately call them) will go along with the happy quilters. Usually the fellows are very patient as we look at quilts and fabric but this time they get to taste the food too, that should keep them smiling.


