

William Furioli, who passed away on January 23, 2013 in Wellsburg, WV. William is DeDe Foley's cousin.





Imagine you are in the nursing home, you are sometimes in pain, you are sometimes lonely, you sometimes just wish for a friendly face, voice, or someone to hold your hand.

ENTER: Gabriel Barrett

Gabriel Barrett "Gabe" is the Shetland Sheep dog owned by Starkdale member CarolynLee Barrett. Gabe was born June 27, 2005 and was adopted in 2007 into CarolynLee's home, life, and heart from the Hounds Haven in Bradly, Ohio (near Smithfield).

CarolynLee says: "When I saw Gabe. I asked what his name was. and Robin (from Hounds Haven) responded that it was Gabriel, like the arch-angel. I knew at that moment that God had a hand in our meeting and getting Gabe and his eventually becoming a therapy dog. At the time I had been helping a friend handle her two therapy dogs at three nursing homes. I asked my friend, Mary, if she would help me teach Gabe to become a therapy dog like her dog "Angel". From May 23-July 25, 2007 Gabe and I went to the Obedience School for the basics.

He was an A Student. Thanks to Dixon's Health Care in Wintersville, Country Club Manor, and Martha Manor both in Steubenyille who allowed me to come with "Angel". Gabe and I were learning with her to do what is expected in nursing home facilities even though we had not taken the actual test. We were learning on the job. As long as Gabe's medical shots, etc. were up to date we were very welcome to visit. We took the Canine Good Citizen and Therapy Dog test on June 27, 2009 and in September of 2009 Gabriel became a registered Therapy Dog with The Bright and Beautiful Therapy Dogs, Inc. "

"We are still visiting three homes once a month", reports CarolynLee. "Gabe always has to announce himself by barking immediately when we enter. Several residents look forward to that bark because they know Gabe is in the building."

On one occasion the nurse asked us to visit a patient who was non-responsive except

it.
