

I have not heard one negative comment and I have spoken to numerous students (one texted me right after the assembly and the kids at her lunch table said that he was the best speaker they ever saw). Teachers, principals, the superintendent of Steubenville Schools and everyone loved him. If you even saw him once I don't need to say anything else...he was outstanding and as one of the principals said to me... "great choice of speaker...he was exactly what we needed". I received a call from another teacher who has been at the school for 30 plus years who said that it was the best inschool program he had ever been to. The Lord truly has opened the doors here in Steubenville for ministry outside of the walls of the church

I also was able to meet with the Superintendent of Steubenville Schools three times, the assistant principal at Big Red twice,
