

A Message from the Pastor—Rev. Dr. Philip Makari

Dear Starkdale Family (Members, Worship Guests, and Friends),

It is truly a great joy to see the church coming back together again and in good numbers after the summer months. I am truly excited about people's commitment to Sunday worship, Bible studies, and community involvement. Yet, there seems to be a common misunderstanding among us and millions of other believers that assumes there is no more to the Christian faith than that. While I don't wish to use the Chimes Newsletter as an opportunity to preach another sermon, it is urgent for me to share with you that the Christian faith involves a lot more than these three areas. The Christian faith also has more to do with healthy relationships within the family, with friends and neighbors, coworkers, school peers, and beyond. Moreover, our faith compels us to be alert to what is happening around us and around the world. It urges us

to defend religious rights, the freedom to speak the truth boldly and lovingly in season and out of season, to impact politicians who represent us, to protest unjust claims (i.e. lies about what we are up to as Christians). Most importantly, our faith calls us to pray without ceasing, to share the Good News of God, in Christ, publically and uncompromisingly, to fulfill our obligation to vote for men and women who uphold the Constitution, understand the spirit of patriotism, and to speak out against any lobbyists that intend to silence the Truth (with a capital T). Let us not permit what has been happening in America within the last ten or fifteen years to continue. If we do, very soon we will lose it all and then have no one to blame but ourselves. It amazes me how the evil forces and the angels of Satan (whether they are from the media, from the government, or from selfinterest groups) are doing a marvelous job of destroying our heritage and traditions while believers in Christ, who

are God's ambassadors (you and I), are acting as if it doesn't matter anymore. This is not the USA to which I came in 1971; neither is it the USA that was twenty years ago. As I said it before, I say it again: Judas was doing his dirty work while Jesus' disciples were asleep, even while Jesus was about to be crucified. The disciples betrayed him, denied him, forsook him and ran away-some out of fear and others due to apathy. It seems the same is happening in our present time. Can we change all that? Can we possibly turn America downside up again as many evangelical revivalists did in the past, or is it too late? My answer is that it is never too late. To see the public schools and the church working side by side to help students seek a higher and better way of life is a sign that revivals can happen again. To know that the school is willing to use public school busses to bring children to a weekly Bible Club at one downtown church is proof that it is never

too late for a revival in America. To acknowledge how willing are the coordinators of a government-sponsored Children's Home to bring children for worship on Sunday tells me that God is making the impossible possible. Can we all be part of what God is doing in our midst? Rev. Bauman has been asking for men and women to come and help, possibly mentor someone, provide refreshments, get to know young families and share with them about the love of God, provide transportation, etc. If that is not where our gifts are, can we at least get in the habit of praying on our knees, and possibly fast as we seek God to heal our nation from the corruption, the apathy, the misplaced priorities, etc.? Brothers and sisters, this is where revival begins, on our knees. Very soon, you will be hearing me urge you to join me periodically in prayers for our communities, our nation and the

Thanksgiving Proclamation

Issued by President George Washington, at the request of Congress, on October 3, 1789

By the President of the United States of America, a Proclamation.

Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and—Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me "to recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:"

Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 26th day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favor, able interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted; for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations, and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us), and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us; and, generally, to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best.
