MESSAGE FROM REV. G. CARL MOORE

But that is not the way you learned Christ!-- ²¹ assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, ²² to put off your old self,¹ which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, ²³ and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness (Eph 4:20-24 ESV)

What is the gospel? Many of us are rightly aware that the gospel consists of Christ's suffering (i.e. dying on the cross) and rising three days later from the dead. Many of us are rightly aware that the gospel consists of faith (i.e. justification by faith) and the forgiveness of sins. But what about repentance? Repentance is impossible without faith. The only way a man can turn to God in repentance is by knowing that he belongs to God. We know that we belong to God by faith. And once we know that we belong to God by faith, then we can turn to God in repentance. God's grace and mercy precedes repentance.

John Calvin was correct to note that repentance consists of two parts: mortification and vivification. Mortification consists of a Christian's awareness of one's sin, sorrow for one's sin, and personal hatred for one's sin. Repentance drives a person to his knees, while confessing his sins in humility of heart. In short, repentance is contrition. Mortification is the negative dimension of repentance. Vivification is the positive dimension of repentance. Vivification is the

As we work our way through the book of 1st Corinthians, let us always keep in the forefront of our minds that the gospel not only includes what Jesus has accomplished on the cross over two thousands years ago, but also includes the benefits that accrue to us; and one of those benefits is repentance, that is to say, transformation from ungodliness to increased godliness, from putting off the old self to putting on the new self, from unholiness to increased holiness, from mortification to vivification!
